AN ACT

2	To amend and reenact R.S. 17:5002(A), (B) and (D), and 5024(B)(1)(a), relative to the
3	Taylor Opportunity Program for Students; to provide relative to the minimum
4	American College Test score required for eligibility for the Opportunity award; to
5	provide with respect to the monetary amounts for awards granted pursuant to the
6	program; to provide relative to future increases in award amounts; and to provide for
7	related matters.
8	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
9	Section 1. R.S. 17:5002(A), (B) and (D), and 5024(B)(1)(a) are hereby amended and
10	reenacted to read as follows:
11	§5002. Awards and amounts
12	A. (1) A student shall be eligible for an Opportunity, Performance, Honors,
13	or TOPS-Tech Award based on his academic achievement.
14	(2) The award amount as provided for in Subsection B or D of this
15	Section to a student enrolled in any given institution shall be equal to the award
16	amount paid for a student at that institution during the 2016-2017 academic
17	year unless the legislature, by law, increases the award amount.
18	B. Any student who is eligible for an Opportunity, Performance, or Honors
19	Award pursuant to this Chapter and who has enrolled:
20	(1) In any public college or university in this state, shall be awarded by the
21	state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the tuition charged
22	by the public college or university during the 2016-2017 academic year.
23	(2) At any regionally accredited independent college or university in the state
24	which is a member of the Louisiana Association of Independent Colleges and

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Universities to pursue an academic undergraduate degree, shall be awarded by the state an amount to be determined by the administering agency to equal the weighted average of amounts paid under this Section for students attending public colleges and universities that offer academic undergraduate degrees at the baccalaureate level <a href="https://ducing.com/ducing

(3) In a school that has a valid and current certificate of registration issued by the Louisiana State Board of Cosmetology in accordance with law and that is accredited by an accrediting organization recognized by the United States Department of Education or in any proprietary school that has a valid and current license issued by the Board of Regents in accordance with law and that is accredited by an accrediting organization recognized by the United States Department of Education, shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the weighted average of amounts paid under this Section for students attending public colleges and universities <u>during the 2016-2017 academic year and</u> who are enrolled in the permitted skill or occupational training, as may be applicable.

(4) In an out-of-state college or university that is specifically designed to accommodate deaf and hard-of-hearing students under R.S. 17:5027(C), shall be awarded an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the weighted average of amounts paid under this Section for students attending Louisiana public colleges and universities that offer academic undergraduate degrees <u>during the</u> 2016-2017 academic year.

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D.(1) Except as otherwise provided in this Subsection, a student who is eligible for a TOPS-Tech Award pursuant to this Chapter and who is enrolled:

(a) In an eligible public college or university that does not offer an academic undergraduate degree at the baccalaureate level in those associate's degree or other shorter-term training and education programs that are aligned to state workforce priorities as determined by the Board of Regents and the Louisiana Workforce Investment Council shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the tuition charged by the college or university **during** 

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the 2016-2017 academic year. If the Board of Regents and the Louisiana Workforce Investment Council determine that a program is no longer aligned with those priorities, an otherwise eligible student who had previously received an award and enrolled in that program may continue to use the award.

- (b) In an eligible college or university other than as provided for in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph in those associate's degree or other shorter-term training education programs that are aligned to state workforce priorities as determined by the Board of Regents and the Louisiana Workforce Investment Council shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the weighted average of amounts paid to students attending an eligible public college or university that does not offer an academic undergraduate degree at the baccalaureate level <u>during the 2016-2017 academic year</u>. If the Board of Regents and the Louisiana Workforce Investment Council determine that a program is no longer aligned with those priorities, an otherwise eligible student who had previously received an award and enrolled in that program may continue to use the award.
- (2) A student who graduated prior to the 2016-2017 school year, who is eligible for a TOPS-Tech Award pursuant to this Chapter, and who is enrolled:
- (a) In an eligible college or university that does not offer an academic undergraduate degree at the baccalaureate level shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the tuition charged by the college or university <u>during the 2016-2017 academic year</u>.
- (b) In an eligible college or university other than as provided for in Subparagraph (a) of this Paragraph shall be awarded by the state an amount determined by the administering agency to equal the weighted average of amounts paid to students attending an eligible public college or university that does not offer an academic undergraduate degree at the baccalaureate level <u>during the 2016-2017</u> <u>academic year</u>.

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§5024. Academic requirements

1 2 B.(1) Except as otherwise provided by this Subsection, a student shall earn 3 the following minimum test scores for the respective awards: 4 (a) For an Opportunity Award, a composite score on the 1990 version of the 5 ACT which is at least equal to or higher than the state's average composite score, rounded to the nearest truncated to a whole number, reported for the prior year but 6 7 never less than twenty or an equivalent concordant value on an enhanced or revised 8 version of such test or on the SAT. 9 10 Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not 11 signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature 12 by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If 13 vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become 14 effective on the day following such approval.
