(ii) The state Department of Education recommends that approval be granted after an annual review that the department shall conduct of each school seeking approval. The annual review may include site visits and shall include a review, at minimum, of the health, safety, and welfare of prekindergarten students.

(b) For the 2026-2027 school year, if an association or organization has submitted a complete application for recognition to the state board and the state board has not acted upon the application prior to the beginning of the 2026-2027 school year, the department shall accept the attestation submitted by the school.

(3) The State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education may revoke its approval of a prekindergarten program operated by a nonpublic school at any time if the board determines that the school has jeopardized the health, safety, or welfare of its students.

F.(1) Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, any school, including a nonpublic school approved by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education or a prekindergarten program attached thereto, that is operated by a federally recognized tribe pursuant to federal law, including the Tribally Controlled Schools Act of 1988, 25 U.S.C. 2501 et seq., is exempt from the provisions of Subsections A through E of this Section and the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to R.S. 17:24.8(E).

(2) Nothing in this Subsection shall be construed to prohibit a school or prekindergarten program provided for in Paragraph (1) of this Subsection from electing to seek or obtain approval by the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education.

G. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, a nonpublic school that operates a prekindergarten program and that does not receive any state or federal funds, from any source, whether directly or indirectly, shall be exempt from the requirements of Subsection D of this Section."

The recordation shall have the effect of a judicial mortgage against the immovable property described therein and may be enforced against the immovable property described therein upon application of the municipality or parish to the clerk of the district court for issuance of a writ in accordance with Code of Civil Procedure Article 2253. The remedies established in this Chapter are nonexclusive and may be pursued independently of each other and in addition to other remedies provided by law. In order for the lien and privilege to arise, the order, judgment, notice of judgment, or lien shall be final and not subject to appeal when recorded in the mortgage office. The lien and privilege shall have ranking as provided by R.S. 9:4821(A)(1).

C. Any liens placed against such immovable property shall be included in the next annual ad valorem tax bill and shall be paid along with such taxes, subject, however, to any valid homestead exemption. Failure to pay the liens shall cause the immovable property in or on which the violation occurred to be subject to the same provisions of law that govern tax sales of immovable property when the immovable property has been declared blighted or a public nuisance by an administrative hearing officer acting in accordance with this Section. The property owners and other parties having interests in the property shall not have a right of redemption. However, if the immovable property has been sold for nonpayment of taxes to a tax sale purchaser other than the municipality, and if the right of redemption from the tax sale has not elapsed at least one year prior to the sale pursuant to this Section, the tax sale purchaser shall have a right of redemption from the sale pursuant to this Section until

one year after the right of redemption from the tax sale elapses. In addition, failure to pay the liens shall also cause such liens and privileges to be subject to enforcement in accordance with R.S. 13:2576. Any liens placed against immovable property that has a legal homestead exemption from taxes will become payable ninety days after the death of the owner thereof or immediately upon recordation of any conventional mortgage on the immovable property or transfer of title to a new owner, whichever occurs first."

E. Procurement and award of ID/IQ construction contracts shall meet the following requirements

(1) Single award ID/IQ construction contracts procured on a low-bid basis may be advertised and awarded using one of the following methods:

(a) In accordance with R.S. 48:252 and 255 for award to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder; or

(b) In accordance with the advertisement and award procedures set forth in this Section.

(2) Multiple-award ID/IQ construction contracts may be procured on a low bid or best value basis, as determined by the department and office of Louisiana highway construction, respectively. Such procurements shall be conducted in accordance with applicable Louisiana public bid and procurement laws including the requirements for advertisements and the procedures set forth in this Section.

(3)(a) The procurement of any multiple-award ID/IQ construction contract or a single award ID/IQ construction contract not advertised and awarded pursuant to R.S. 48:252 and 255, shall commence with the department and the office of Louisiana highway construction, respectively, issuing a "notice of intent" (NOI) through advertisement on their designated webpages to request letters of interest (LOI). The NOI shall be advertised for at least ten business days prior to the deadline for submission of LOI and shall include a description of the ID/IQ services to be procured. The department and the office of Louisiana highway construction may also readvertise the NOI using additional media or publications and may readvertise as necessary if the number of responses received is deemed insufficient to ensure adequate competition."

(b) After the deadline for submission of LOI for a single-award or multiple-award ID/IQ construction contract, the department and office of Louisiana highway construction shall issue a Request for Proposals ("RFP") to all contractors that submitted an LOI. The RFP shall include instructions for proposal preparation and submission, a description of the evaluation methodology, and shall comply with the requirements of this Section.

(c) Bid bonds in accordance with R.S. 48:253 shall be specified in the department and the office of Louisiana highway construction's standard specifications or special provisions. The department and the office of Louisiana highway construction may waive the requirement for bid bonds for procurements under this Section.

(4)(a) The assistant secretary for project delivery, with the concurrence of the secretary or designee, and the executive director of the office of Louisiana highway construction, respectively, shall establish an evaluation committee for evaluation of proposals

received in response to the RFP. The evaluation committee may, in its discretion, be assisted by other departments and office of Louisiana highway construction personnel and external advisors in the evaluation the proposals.

(b) The evaluation committee shall evaluate the proposals and make a recommendation of award to the secretary and executive director. The secretary, executive director, or their designees, shall make the final determination of award.

(5) Prior to issuing a work order under a multiple-award ID/IQ construction contract, the department and the office of Louisiana highway construction, respectively, shall solicit competitive responses from the contractors awarded ID/IQ contracts under the solicitation in accordance with procedures set forth in the ID/IQ construction contract. The procurement documents or contract shall state the procedures and selection criteria for issuance of work orders. Work orders shall be awarded on a competitive low bid basis, or, where permitted by applicable law and approved for use with federal funds, on a best value basis in which price is a significant evaluation factor.

(6) Proposals received by the department and the office of Louisiana highway construction and the evaluation committee's records, including the evaluation committee's findings, grading, score sheets, and recommendations, shall not be public records until the ID/IQ construction contract has been fully executed or the procurement has been cancelled. Following contract execution or cancellation, such records shall be subject to disclosure in accordance with applicable public records laws. Proprietary, confidential, trade secret, or otherwise protected information will remain exempt to the extent permitted by law. The meetings of the evaluation committee will not be subject to the Open Meetings Law in Title 44 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes.

F. The department and the office of Louisiana highway construction may include the following items in their procurement documents or contracts:

(1) The method for determining price escalation or de-escalation procedures when warranted by particular circumstances.

(2) Special provisions specific to ID/IQ construction contracts.

(3) Unit pricing or lists of work items specific to the ID/IQ construction contract.

(4) A minimum quantity or dollar value if the department and the office of Louisiana highway construction opts to set a minimum.

(5) A statement of procedures and selection criteria the department and office of Louisiana highway construction shall use in issuing work orders.

(6) Any other information, terms, or requirements the department and the office of Louisiana highway construction deem necessary to include in procurement documents or contracts."
